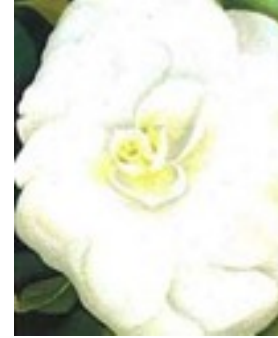


GEORGIA O'KEEFE
